Black Mulch is untreated, dyed woodchip that locks in moisture and suppresses weeds. It is a mulch of choice for professional landscapers due to its decorative look. Suitable for all types of gardens, mass plantings and public spaces.

## HANDLING PROCEDURE

Black Mulch is dyed untreated woodchip that has been cured over several months. However, coloured mulch may potentially stain. Although we make every effort to ensure that our coloured mulch is dry, we are unable to offer any guarantee that staining will not occur if blown next to sensitive areas i.e. house walls, concrete driveways etc. Ensure you protect these areas with plywood sheets or similar.

## FREIGHTING & APPLYING

A truck and trailer of Black Mulch holds approximately 50m<sup>3</sup>. Suitable for blower trucks. Spread Black Mulch to a depth of 50-100mm around newly planted areas or over existing gardens.

## RECOMMENDED USE

- Use Living Earth Black Mulch around plants to a depth of minimum 50mm
- Perfect for locking in moisture at the roots of the plants and keeping weeds out
